

How to judge your 4-H Members:

1. Never judge a child alone. Remember a rule of 3 is best. This can be done by 2 advisors judging or parents/members can always view the judging but not be part of the judging.
2. Be welcoming and asking how they are doing. Congratulate them for completing their project by going through this interview. Your goal is to have a positive experience with an adult mentor!!
3. 6 ft. distancing (no matter what), do not touch books/display etc. have the youth show you from the distance, masks expected (keep everyone safe).

Possible Questions:

- o What project activities did you complete? (Have the youth show you in their project book and/or in display, pictures, posters, etc.)
- o What did you learn about?
- o What was your favorite part of the project?
- o What was the most challenging/hardest part of the project?
- o What skills did you learn that you will use?
- o Did you enjoy (or Not) the project? Why?
- o Give me examples of things you learned
- o Would you recommend this project to another member and why?
- o Etc.
